The school's IBDP coordinator, Mr. Charles Hearsom, said that the Covid-19 pandemic led the IBO to make the very difficult decision to cancel the May 2021 examinations. According to the IBO 'Students who cannot sit the examinations will be awarded grades using their internal coursework marks and teacher submitted predicted grades based on the students whole-body of work. The IB have taken great care to ensure that the grade boundaries take into consideration the significant disruption students have faced during the pandemic. The IB will undertake a detailed review of results before results release to ensure they are appropriate at student, school, subject and global level.

For the graduating class of 2021, the 98% pass rate is a sizeable achievement under very difficult circumstances, which reflects the students' hard work and dedication to their studies. In the top achievers, 6% of Diploma students achieved 40+ points which is remarkable in the current context.
