<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Know how to trace, transfer and cut a simple image onto a piece of lino ready for printing.</li><li>• Know how to ink and roll to create a lino print.</li><li>• Know how to draw a landscape using one-point perspective.</li><li>• Know how to apply shadow in the correct direction according to the light source.</li><li>• Know how to create an Omani landscape scene using watercolour and influenced by the artist Georgia O'Keefe.</li><li>• Know how to use a range of chalk pastel techniques.</li><li>• Apply chalk pastel techniques in an art work to create a variety of effects.</li><li>• Know how to create a chalk pastel landscape.</li><li>• Know how to apply a post-impressionistic style to an art work taking influence from Vincent Van Gogh.</li></ul>	<p>Students will learn the features of landscape art and apply these in a range of media.</p> <p>Students will start the project by designing and creating a simple landscape lino print.
